<u>The 5-session workshop will cover the</u> <u>basic principles of positive behavior</u> <u>programming</u>.

Its focus will be on helping parents of children with developmental disabilities to change their own behavior and that of their children. Parents will be actively Involved In this workshop and will be Invited to discuss the specific behavioral challenges they are confronting. The last session on 4/15 will focus on toilet training. Parents Interested In toilet training are also encouraged to attend the first 4 sessions.

She lives in Orange County and is a Clinical Supervisor at Footprints Behavioral Interventions. Yesenia's goal is to help as many children develop and increase appropriate skills and decrease maladaptive behaviors utilizing efficient, effective, evidence-based Applied Behavior Analysis practices while at the same time empowering their parents and caregivers to do the same.
