<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diagnosis and treatment given • Location • How did the consumer get there? • Discharge orders • Follow-up appointments 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Behaviors leading up to the incident • Treatment other than observation (labs, meds changes) and anticipated discharge date • Behavior Plan in place/changed? • Past behavioral history or psychiatric admissions • Can consumer return to the facility or home? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Description of alleged perpetrator -- name, general physical description, relationship to consumer (required by Title 17) • Police involvement (officer name, badge number, department, phone number) -- SCs will request reports
Missing Person		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be prepared with a recent photo and general description of the consumer, including what he or she was wearing at the time he or she went missing. • Where was the consumer last seen and with whom? • Do you know where the consumer may be? • Does the consumer typically leave and stay away after certain precursors? • RCOC's Communications Coordinator will follow up with an "alert" as necessary. 		
Death		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What were the events leading up to death? • When was the consumer last in stable health? • What did the consumer do the day before he or she died? • Was the consumer's activity/appetite normal? If tube fed, were feedings being tolerated normally? • When was the last time the consumer was seen by a physician? • When was the last time the consumer was checked by a nurse? • When was the consumer last seen by a staff member? • Was any type of intervention or resuscitation attempted? • What is the presumed cause of death?
